Happy New Year!

You may have noticed a slight increase (effective January 1, 2013) in your water usage rates. In order to meet the rising costs of water treatment and the need for an increase in the replacement fund, SWA's Board of Directors agreed to a ten-cent increase per each thousand gallons of water used (above 2,000 gallons) by rural customers. The rural rate is now \$3.96 per thousand gallons of treated water. For contract customers, there is now a twelve-cent increase per thousand gallons of water used. The contract rate is now \$3.50 per thousand gallons of treated water. In both cases, the cost of each treated gallon of water remains below one-half cent per gallon.

Water Convention, the Southwest Pipeline Project is budgeted to receive \$79 million in order to continue meeting its goal of providing water to southwest North Dakota. With the \$79 million, we will be able to complete construction for all rural customers waiting for water as well as increasing the capacity to meet the unprecedented growth throughout the southwest region of our state.

The Board also determined the need for a monthly increase of seventy cents to pay for the increase in capital repayment which pays back to the state the funding for the Project. The monthly base rate is now \$44.05 per month.

For those of you waiting for hooking up to our quality water, we appreciate your patience. Please know that we are striving to get water to you. Governor Jack Dalrymple announced to the North Dakota Legislature and at the recent North Dakota

More than 300 additional miles of pipeline for two new service area contracts will soon deliver our quality water to more than 400 new customers in the coming months and, by the end of next summer (August, 2013), we project to have a 300,000-gallon reservoir in place. It's important to know, our number one priority has always been and will always be quality water for you, our customers, so we are delighted for people to know we are working as quickly as possible in developing additional service areas to meet growth and demand needs. 💧

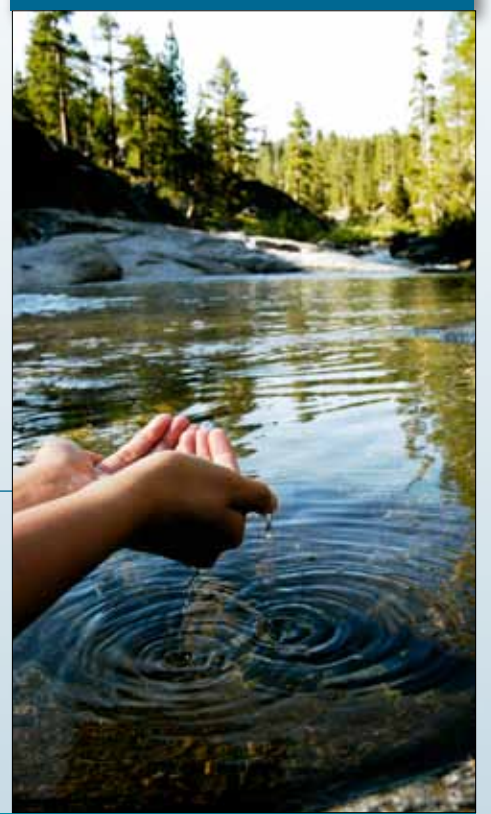

Did You Know...

The minimum fee that appears on your monthly statement includes 2,000 gallons of purified water, the meter, and capital repayment fees. The consumption and usage fee is billed based on actual amount of gallons of treated water that goes through your meter monthly ABOVE the 2,000 gallons that are included in the minimum fee. The water consumption and usage is determined by the monthly meter reading.

Your water usage fee is billed based on actual use per-thousand gallons of treated water that goes through your meter monthly ABOVE the 2,000 gallons that are included in your base fee. The water usage is determined by your monthly meter reading.



Southwest Water Authority Received Fluoridation Award



The North Dakota Department of Health announced that the Southwest Water Authority received the Water Fluoridation Quality Award from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Fluoridation is the adjustment of fluoride in the water to a level that is optimal for preventing tooth decay. The award recognizes those communities that maintained a consistent level of optimally fluoridated water throughout 2011.

“We are pleased that more states and communities than ever achieved this measure of excellence in their water fluoridation programs,” stated Dr. William Bailey, DDS, MPH, acting director of the CDC Division of Oral Health. “Community water fluoridation is one of the most effective means available for avoiding tooth decay, preventing at least 25% of tooth decay in children and adults.”

About Us

The Southwest Water Authority (SWA) was established by the North Dakota State Legislature in 1991. The SWPP transports raw water from Lake Sakakawea to water treatment plants in Mercer County, the OMND WTP, and in Dickinson where it is treated and delivered to more than 48,000 people in 31 communities covering 4,400 rural service locations. Governor Accelerates Funding for Water Projects



On December 5th, Governor Jack Dalrymple released his 2013-2015 Executive Budget. It was quickly evident that the State remains committed to helping fund improvements such as the Southwest Pipeline Project. “Never before in our state's history have we had a structural balance to our General Fund budget as strong as what we are proposing today,” Dalrymple said. “We have

worked hard for our prosperity and now it's time to put our prosperity to work for us.” The budget that Governor Dalrymple delivered included an allocation of \$79 million during the next biennium for the Southwest Pipeline Project.
